- Bettendorf (City of): The city of Bettendorf will be present to answer citizen's questions about floodplain development, the city's flood plan, city resources available, and more.
- Bi-State Regional Commission: The Bi-State
 Regional Commission has information about the

 impacts transportation. Bi-State has information

- **Buffalo (City of):** The City of Buffalo will be available to answer questions about the City's flood plan, what city resources might be available, flood proofing measures, and more.

- Corps of Engineers: Mission: to deliver vital engineering solutions to secure our Nation, energize our economy, and reduce disaster risk. The Corps will be presenting a sand-bagging demonstration with proper filling and placing.
- Davenport (City of): Davenport staff will be onhand to answer questions about your flood risk, available city resources, flood proofing measures, regulations for improvement and development in the floodplain, substantial damage, and the flood plan. Staff will also be surveying property owners about their interest in a future/potential costshare program to help reduce flood risk.
